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while the object it affects is "woman."

A prepositional phrase is a group of words that lacks either a verb or a subject, and that functions as a unified part of speech. It normally consists of a preposition and a noun or a preposition and a pronoun.. Remember the following rules for prepositional phrases and you will find that using them becomes much easier.

A prepositional phrase often appears after the word it modifies, as in this sentence: Ben slipped on the top rung of the ladder. In this sentence, the phrase on the top rung modifies and directly follows the verb slipped, and the phrase of the ladder modifies and directly follows the noun rung.

## **What Are Prepositional Phrases in English Grammar?**

(The prepositional phrase describes the noun "scarf." We could have written "dotted scarf," which proves that "with dots" is functioning as an adjective.) The man on the radio has a boring voice. (The prepositional phrase describes the noun "man.") Give me one of the brown ones. (The prepositional phrase describes the pronoun "one.")

## **Prepositional Phrase | What Is a Prepositional Phrase?**

A prepositional phrase serves as an adjective or adverb; that is, it modifies a noun or a verb. In the sentence "He left after lunch," the prepositional phrase after lunch is used as an adverb to modify the verb left. It tells us when he left, as do "He left earlier" or "He left later."

The use of the prepositional phrase to modify a noun or a verb is known as either an adjectival phrase or an adverbial phrase, respectively. At the very least, the prepositional phrase will be made up from one preposition as well as the object which it governs, although there may be more than one preposition in place.
