### SEPARATION ANXIETY - IACAPAP

- Some anxiety at separation developmentally normal
- Usually peaks at 9-13 months of age
- Decreases after age 2
- Increased autonomy at age 3
- Increases again at age 4-5
- Parental anxiety disorder persistent SAD in child
- Genetics
- Decreased exposure to separation
- Diagnosis not made before age 5

### ANXIETY DISORDERS IN CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS

The prevalence of anxiety disorders in early childhood is estimated in various studies to range from 6.5% to 20%. The most common disorders in very young children are Generalized Anxiety Disorder, Separation Anxiety Disorder, Social Anxiety Disorder, and Specific Phobia. Comorbidity among anxiety disorders is not uncommon in the preschool years.

### Commonly Presenting Symptoms

Many of the symptoms of separation anxiety disorder are physical complaints that do not have a readily obvious link to anxiety: Headaches Fainting spells, dizziness and light-headedness Disturbed sleep, nightmares Nausea, vomiting or stomach pain Muscle cramps and pains Chest pain Heart

### **Separation Anxiety**

Separation anxiety disorder occurs when the individual "...experiences excessive fear or anxiety concerning separation from those to whom the individual is attached..." The person to whom the anxious individual is "attached," is typically a close blood relative, a spouse or intimate partner, or roommate.

Separation anxiety, when extreme, is usually pretty easy to identify. Adults who have serious separation anxiety tend to have an unhealthy attachment to a person with whom they are close to, and experience intense anxiety and panic when having to separate from that person.

### **How to Manage Adult Separation Anxiety - Calm Clinic**

Separation anxiety disorder is the most common anxiety disorder in children under 12 years of age, with a gradual decrease in frequency as children mature into adolescence and adulthood. However, separation anxiety can continue well into adulthood, and even begin in adulthood.

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
